## 1 HISTORIC SITE PARK IKEGAMI-SONE RUINS

The total area of the ruins is around 600,000 m<sup>2</sup>, and the central area of around 115,000 m<sup>2</sup> is a national historic landmark. About one third of the ruins are maintained as a public park and contain the large, restored structure Izumi-ko Takakono.

## 2 HOKUBU REGION CENTER

The center was built with locally sourced Izumoku wood, and it has meeting rooms, a cooking training room, multipurpose rooms, and grounds outside available for a variety of purposes. It also has a library, and a public service center to aid residents by issuing various official certificates and identification documents.

## 3 OSAKA PREFECTURAL MUSEUM OF YAYOI CULTURE

This is the only museum in Japan that focuses on the Yayoi period (generally accepted to date from 300 B.C. to 300 A.D.). It offers a glimpse at lifestyles and outside interactions of the time, and holds archaeology seminars and activities related to Yayoi culture to help visitors learn about the origins of Japanese culture.

## 4 KUMANO ROAD (OGURI ROAD)

The Kumano pilgrimage route leads from Kyoto to Mt. Kuma via Osaka. The name Oguri Road comes from legends about historical figure Oguri Hangan and Princess Tenmei.

## 5 THE SEAT OF AN ANCIENT PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT

The name Fuchu derives from this place being the ancient capital ("fuchu") of Izumi province. There is a monument to the old capital seat inside Mitachiyama Children's Park near Izumi Inoue Shrine.

## 6 IZUMI CITY PLAZA

This community center has public functions with a lifelong learning center, performance hall, library, and a city office space, as well as being a place for public interaction.

## 7 CENTRAL PARK

This park near Izumi Chuo Station is a popular local relaxation spot. There is also a walking course in the park for all to use.

## 8 MIYANOE PARK

This park has a grassy field and a playground complex. It also has the Miyano Plaza Ryokuka Center (Greenery Center) and the Izumi City Izumimokuri History Museum.

## 9 OSAKA RESEARCH INST. OF INDUSTRIAL SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

A joint facility built by the city and prefecture of Osaka to offer SMEs technical assistance to promote applied advanced technologies in local industry.

## 10 MATSUOJI TEMPLE

This temple is loved for its beautiful cherry blossoms and autumn foliage. The grounds and main hall together are a prefecture-designated cultural asset.

## 11 MT. MAKIO SEFUKUJI TEMPLE

This Tendai-school Buddhist temple on Mt. Makio is the fourth temple on the Saikoku 33 temple pilgrimage. Sights here include red weeping cherry blossoms in spring and the autumn leaves, as well as a statue of Kannon, who guides emperor-turned-monk Kannon, and Houchi-dai Kannon. The principal object of worship, the 485 meter Mikuro-Buddha, and the 5 meter Houchi-dai Kannon are known as the Great Buddhas of Izumi Province.

## 12 KUSUNOKI PARK

This sports park has health equipment, a multi-purpose plaza, tennis courts and more.

## 13 IZUMI RECYCLING ENVIRONMENT PARK

This park is built on the remains of an old landfill. It now has lovely scenery of year-round flower beds and farm fields.
